| HALF TERM 1 | |
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| Composing skills: Using The Primary Triads to harmonise a melody. HALF TERM 2 | Pupils will learn/be able to: Understand the Primary Triads Perform the Primary Triads on the keyboard and ukulele Learn how to add the Primary Triads to a melody Pupils will learn/be able to: |
| The Primary Triads in Blues | Recap the Primary Triads and learn how they are used in Jazz and Blues e.g., within a 12-bar Blues Chord Sequence. Know, recognise, and perform the Primary Triads in a variety of ways including as a Walking Bass Line and syncopated chordal patterns. Understand and demonstrate what makes an "effective" Jazz improvisation using the notes of the Blues Scale. Know and recognise different types and styles of Jazz and instruments, timbres and sonorities within Jazz and Blues music. Create a performance of The Blues, in pairs, using keyboard/ukulele/voice and the techniques they have learnt throughout the topic. |
| HALF TERM 3 + 4 | |
| Musical Structures: Binary and Ternary forms | Pupils will learn/be able to: Understand what Form and Structure is in music. Recap Question and Answer, Introduce Binary and Ternary Forms. Identify different sections within a complete piece of music. Understand why Form and Structure is important in music. Develop composing skills by composing a Binary piece Learn how to compose a minor melody Learn about secondary chords and how to add them to their melodies Develop performance and ensemble skills |
| HALF TERM 5 | |
| Ostinatos and riffs | This scheme explores music based on repeated musical patterns through the genres of Popular Music (Hooks and Riffs) and Music from the Western Classical Tradition (Ostinatos). Pupils will learn/be able to: Understand and distinguish between Hooks, Riffs and Ostinatos. Perform, create and listen to and appraise a range of music from different times and places based on Repeated Musical Patterns. |
| HALF TERM 6 | |
| Music around the world | This scheme explores Music from countries around the world. They will take a journey from one country to the next each week, and use the musical knowledge they have developed over year 7 and 8 to explore the similarities and differences between different cultures and perform music from each area. The countries to be visited are: The Caribbean (Reggae), Brazil (Samba), China (use of the pentatonic scale), Indonesia (Gamelan), South Africa (Gospel), Ireland (Irish Folk). |
