Year 11 Mock Exam Fortnight – Monday 6th – Friday 17th November

It is important that pupils prepare fully for these exams, so they can perform to their full potential. Pupils need to be encouraged to revise regularly at home and attend any revision sessions that have been organised by subject teachers. Year 11 mock exams play an integral part in preparing pupils for their GCSE summer exams and Post 16 Education. Mock exam results can have a big impact on deciding the final pathway in preparing individual pupils for their summer exams including final tiers of entry.

It is important that pupils try their best during this mock examination period so that our teachers can identify pupil's strengths and areas that they need further support with. These exams are important and pupils should revise for each subject thoroughly. Pupils must take each exam seriously and strive to do their best in all subjects.

The exams will take place in the gym under external exam conditions. There will be invigilators supervising the exams and all normal exam procedures will be followed.

Our School Council is made up of pupils from each year group (7-11), who are elected to represent the views of all pupils and to improve the school, they have regular meetings to listen to and represent the views of fellow pupils. Being elected to the school council is a good opportunity to learn how to present an argument and bring about change to improve the school.

In the library on October 10th we had the first Pupil Council meeting of this academic year. It was a very well attended meeting with pupils from all year groups taking part to represent their year. They discussed and provided feedback on some key points including the end of year prizes, a child on child abuse policy and the school menu. 100% Attendance

In school there is a clear link between attendance and success. Excellent attendance and punctuality are essential for thorough exam and assessment preparation. Pupils with excellent attendance and punctuality are more likely to achieve or beat their targets at GCSE than those whose attendance is a cause for concern. Our best results correspond with our highest attendance levels. This is why our attendance target of 100% is so important.


To encourage our pupils, and create some healthy competition, we now have an attendance competition each week. Every pupil that has 100% attendance for the week will be put into their year group draw, with a voucher up for grabs but you will need to be in the following week to collect your prize during your year group assembly. Pupils are absolutely loving this incentive and attendance has been great so far this academic year, we thank parents and carers for their support such an important matter.

The PTFA 50/50 Club

The PTFA 50-50 Club has proved to be a big success in terms of raising much needed funds to resource additional incentives and facilities for children at St Augustine's. The club works by friends of the school purchasing numbers at a cost of £1 each. You can buy any amount of numbers from two upwards (minimum £2 per month). These numbers will then be entered into a draw at the end of each month. At present, the first prize is £40, second prize £20 and third prize £15; **prizes will increase as more members join.** The remaining funds then go to the PTFA to fund school initiatives. Mobile Phone Use in School

Please be mindful that mobile phone use during the school day is not permitted. New guidance from the Department for Education encourages banning mobile phone use throughout the school day, including at break times, to tackle disruptive behaviour and online bullying while boosting attention during lessons. This newest guidance aims to support the wider work the government is doing to raise standards in schools by increasing students' focus and reducing distractions.

If you need to get a message to your child, please do so by contacting the school office who are more than happy to pass important information on. Also, if a pupil needs to contact home, they must get permission from a member of staff to make a call from the school office.

If a pupil is found to be using a phone during the school day, it will be confiscated until the end of the week.

School Uniform

Looking clean, decent and well-groomed influences how others treat us and gives us a head start in life. We are pleased that our pupils are regularly complimented on their appearance. Our rules on uniform and appearance have evolved over time and are strongly influenced by the feedback we get from parents who set high standards at home and like to see these being reinforced at school. They want their children to go to school dressed in an appropriate way and they support our emphasis on respect for the dignity of young people. In turn, we value the strong backing we get from parents over uniform matters.

Our uniform is compulsory and must be worn correctly by all pupils at all times in school. Every child admitted to the school has been given a place on the clear understanding that their parents or carers accept and comply with our policies.

Please be reminded that year 7-10 pupils must wear their burgundy, long-sleeved v-necked pullover when we return to school on Monday 30th October.
